do anything for the QSI decoders, other than the basic CVs 1 defined by the NMRA. And the fact that there were a group 2 of people that were interested in developing this type of 3 product in an open source -- I was quite excited to help 4 5 contribute. If Mr. Katzer had -- let me step back a 6 7 second. If you knew that Mr. Katzer had incorporated 8 a modified version of your file in his products but that 9 he did not file JMRI's license terms, would that affect 10 whether you would continue to contribute files to JMRI? 11 12 A Yes. 13 Why? 0 It -- for somebody else to use my creation, 14 15 that I had not deliberately given them that -- I mean, 16 granted, the JMRI project being open source, anybody can 17 look at it and use it and modify it, but they're supposed to give credit to those people who -- who did it. And if 18 19 I'm not going to get credit for what I did, then I would have to cease my contributions, because there really was a 20 21 lot of effort in this. 22 Have you heard if Mr. Katzer was
